	A graduate-level internship of 600 clock hours supervised by an on-site CRC by a <b>faculty member who is a CRC</b> .	
	The internship must have been in rehabilitation counseling and the intern must have a minimum of 240 clock hours providing direct rehabilitation counseling services to individuals with disabilities.	
	Graduate credit must be awarded and must appear on an official transcript. The <a href="Internship Verification Form">Internship Verification Form</a> must be submitted with the application.	
	12 months of acceptable work experience under the <b>supervision of a CRC</b> . (See Section 6).	
	The Employment and/or Supervision Verification Form must be submitted with the application. This is available on the CRCC website	
	24 months of acceptable work experience. The <u>Employment and/or Supervision</u> <u>Verification Form</u> must be submitted with the application.	
	24 months of full-time employment teaching in a rehabilitation counseling (RC) or clinical rehabilitation counseling (CLRC) program subsequent to earning the master's or doctoral degree.	
	Full-time employment is defined as 6 semesters, 8 quarters, or 2 contractual periods of 12 months and must include the supervision of students and/or direct clinical work with a population of individuals with disabilities.	
	The Educator/Employment Verification Form must be submitted with the application.
